About the project:

Dr. Snapp developed and implemented a longitudinal point-of-care ultrasound (POCUS) curriculum and the REACT (Rapid-Response Education and Code Training) program at

the University of Cincinnati, addressing identified gaps in GME. Using Kern's six-step approach and evidence-based strategies, she created needs assessments, learning objectives, hands-on didactic sessions, and simulation scenarios to improve residents' competence and confidence in high-acuity situations. Both programs have shown measurable improvements in knowledge and confidence among participants, with sustainable integration into the curriculum and pathways for ongoing use. Dr. Snapp's work exemplifies excellence in GME by addressing gaps, improving education, and enhancing patient care outcomes, with plans to share the curriculum and resources for adoption at other institutions.
